Class -4

Ch. -3 Adjectives (quality, quantity and Number)

Adjectives can be divided into three broad categories quantity and quality and Number.

Adjectives of quantity refer to how many or how much of something.

Adjectives of quality refer to the kind, degree, or quality of something.

Sometimes, adjectives of quality are called descriptive adjective

Adjective of quantity is used with noun.

We get these numeral adjectives to know the quantity by asking a question 'how much?' to a noun or pronoun.

These quantity telling words tell us the amount of noun but does not tell the exact number.

Adjectives of Quantity are used when we don't want the exact number of noun.

Here are some examples of adjectives of quantity-

- I took **some** notebooks.
- They had **enough** plates.
- He gave all his pens.
- He has **no** qualification.
- I have **no** faith in him.
- You did not take **any** book.
- She asked him to give **half** material.
- Many students were present today.
- I have completed **mos**t of my work.
- Baby ate the **whole** banana.
- I don't have **much** time.

- Sam has **little** interest in drawing.
- She has **sufficient** facility to learn the computer skills.
- We spent a **few** rupees for watching cinema.
- They showed **great** courage when they met with an accident.

Adjectives of Quality

'Adjectives of Quality' give more information about quality of a thing or person.

Adjective of quality is used to describe the subject or noun.

These adjectives specify quality as well as state <u>and</u> action of a noun.

We get Adjectives of Quality by asking question 'of what kind?' to a noun to know the quality of noun.

Here are some examples-

- He is a <u>clever</u> boy.
- He is a <u>nice</u> guy.
- Japan is a <u>developed</u> country.
- Sara is a <u>beautiful</u> girl.
- My boss is an <u>honest</u> person.
- This is a <u>heavy</u> box.
- Naina has a <u>black</u> dog.
- She is an <u>intelligent</u> girl.
- Mumbai is a <u>beautiful</u> city.
- Our principal is an <u>old</u> woman.
- Dog is an <u>honest</u> animal.
- The <u>big</u> hotel is built last year.
- My son is <u>wise</u>.
- New Delhi is a <u>large</u> city.

Adjective of Number:-

- "It Expresses The Definite Quantity Of Noun"
- Or in easy words we can say that "It tells us the exact number of something"
- Let's say someone asks me "Ms Manisha, Tell Me How Many Students Are In Your Class"?
- So I Say "I Have <u>Thirty</u> Students"

So in this sentence thirty is Adjective of number.

Examples Sentences:

- 1. I have <u>five</u> students.
- 2. They have <u>four</u> carpets.
- 3. I have <u>three</u> glasses.
- 4. They have <u>20</u> Cupboards.
- 5. She has <u>one</u> Pencil.
- 6. You have <u>3</u> Pillows.
- 7. She has three rings.
- 8. I have learnt<u>Nine</u> Chapters.
- 9. They have <u>10</u> Employees.
- 10. She buys <u>70</u> Apples.
- 11. I have <u>one</u> microphone.
- 12. He has three dogs.
