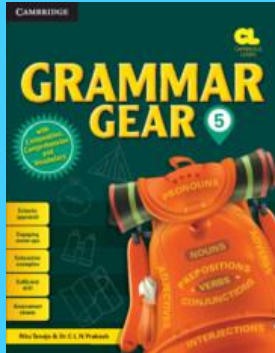

# The Present Perfect Tense Usage

## The Present Perfect is used:

- To express things you have done in your life

Examples: *I have been to Singapore once.*

*India has won the tournament.*

- To describe recently completed actions which are important now

Examples: *My aunt has baked a cake just now.*

*The movie has just started.*

- To express situations that started in the past and are still true

Examples: *I have known James for 4 or 5 years.*



# STRUCTURE OF PRESENT PERFECT

- Subject + has/have + V3 (past participle) + Object.
- Has -> Singular, Have -> Plural.

I You We They	have	eaten	an apple.
He She It John	has	eaten	an apple.



## AFFIRMATIVE

I **have** played  
You **have** played  
He **has** played  
She **has** played  
It **has** played  
We **have** played  
You **have** played  
They **have** played

## NEGATIVE

I **haven't** played  
You **haven't** played  
He **hasn't** played  
She **hasn't** played  
It **hasn't** played  
We **haven't** played  
You **haven't** played  
They **haven't** played

## INTERROGATIVE

**Have** I played?  
**Have** you played?  
**Has** he played?  
**Has** she played?  
**Has** it played?  
**Have** we played?  
**Have** you played?  
**Have** they played?

3<sup>rd</sup> Person

He  
She  
It

has

## Answers

Yes, I have. / No, I haven't

Yes, she has. / No, she hasn't





# The Past Perfect Tense Usage

## The Past Perfect Tense is used:

- The past perfect tense is used to express an action that was completed before another action started in the past.

## STRUCTURE OF PAST PERFECT TENSE

Subject + had + V3 (past participle) + Object.



+	-	?
I had worked	I hadn't worked	Had I worked?
You had worked	You hadn't worked	Had you worked?
He/she/it had worked	He/she/it had worked	Had he/she/it worked?
We had worked	We hadn't worked	Had we worked?
You had worked	You hadn't worked	Had you worked?
They had worked	They hadn't worked	Had they worked?
