

Comparative & Superlative adjectives



ADJECTIVES

Adjectives are words that describe or modify another person or thing in the sentence.






COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES

When comparing 2 things.

One syllable adjectives: add -er

Cold → colder

High → higher



One syllable adjectives ending in one vowel + consonant: double the consonant and add -er

Big → bigger

Hot → hotter

Northern states are colder than Southern states.

Adjectives ending in y: change y to -ier.

Dry → drier

Easy → easier

Two or more syllable adjectives: add MORE before the adjective

Difficult \rightarrow more difficult

Beautiful > more beautiful

Irregular

Good → better


Bad → worse

SUPERLATIVE ADJ.

ONE **SYLLABLE**

ending in E

Add -er small → smaller

Tall →

old \rightarrow

Add -r

Large → larger

Wise \rightarrow

Add -est

Small → smallest

Tall \rightarrow

old \rightarrow

ONE

Add -st

large → largest

Wise →

ONE **SYLLABLE** Ending with a single consonant with a vowel

before it

double the consonant and add -er Big → bigger Thin → Fat >

double the consonant and add -est Big → biggest Thin →

	COMPARATIVE ADJ.	SUPERLATIVE ADJ.
TWO SYLLABLE Ending in y	Change y to -ier Happy → happier Angry → Busy →	Change y to -iest Happy → happiest Angry → Busy →
TWO SYLLABLE ending in -er, - le, or -ow	Take the -er form of the adjective Narrow → narrower Gentle →	Take the -est form of the adjective Narrow → narrowest Gentle →
TWO, THREE OR MORE SYLLABLE ADJECTIVES	Add MORE before the adjective Pleasant → more pleasant Careful → Thoughtful → Beautiful → Important →	Add MOST before the adjective Pleasant → most pleasant Careful → Thoughtful → Beautiful → Important →

IRREGULAR ADJECTIVES

Irregular Adjective	Comparative Form	Superlative Form
good	better	best
bad	worse	worst
far	farther	farthest
little	less	least
many	more	most

How to use them in a sentence...

COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES

Comparative adjective + than Andrew is smaller than Tom.

SUPERLATIVE ADJECTIVES

The + superlative adjective

He is the smallest kid in the class.
